This applies unless they have received their full COVID-19 vaccination, can provide evidence of this and show no COVID-19 symptoms. From 20 August 2021 passengers who have been in India in the previous 14 days are permitted entry into Uganda but will be required to undergo a mandatory PCR test on arrival, at their own expense, regardless of their vaccination status.</p> <p>Passengers arriving or departing from Entebbe International Airport can only be picked up or dropped off by a maximum of two people, including the driver, in order to avoid crowding.</p> <p>Vehicles with more than the authorised number of people will not be allowed access to the airport.</p>	<p>Nairobi, Mombasa, Dar as Salaam, Juba, Mogadishu, Kinshasa, Bujumbura, Kilimanjaro</p> <p>https://www.travel.doc.aero/</p>	<p>Yes: From 22 September all travelers (including children aged three and under), irrespective of country of origin or vaccination status, will be required to provide a negative COVID-19 test certificate on arrival.</p>	<p>All travelers whose body temperature is NOT above 37.5°C (99.5°F), and do not have persistent cough, difficulty in breathing, or other flu – like symptoms, and have a negative COVID -19 Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) test certificate issued within 72 hours from the time of sample collection to boarding aircraft will be allowed into the country.</p>	<p>All travelers whose body temperature is NOT above 37.5°C (99.5°F), and do not have persistent cough, difficulty in breathing, or other flu – like symptoms, and have a negative COVID -19 Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) test certificate issued within 72 hours from the time of sample collection to boarding aircraft will be allowed into the country.</p>	<p>A list of possible flights can be accessed from Entebbe Airport's website here: https://bit.ly/3C02XqQ</p>	<p>A list of possible flights can be accessed from Entebbe Airport's website here: https://bit.ly/3C02XqQ</p>
