Brexit discussion - Keep calm and carry on

More than 120 members and guests of the BNZBA and the NZGBA, together with a number of AUT faculty members, attended this panel (pictured from left to right: H.M. Jonathan Sinclair, British High Commissioner to New Zealand, Monique Surges, CEO NZGBA, Simon Tucker, New Zealand Foreign Affairs & Trade, Danae Anderson, AUT University Business School). The event aimed to provide more clarity around the future progress and likely impact of Brexit. Monique's presentation included the results of a feetent survey of German businesses which confirmed that the uncertainty created by the Brexit vote will cause them to view business opportunities with the UK more negatively and will likely cause business volumes to drop.



Budget surplus for Europe's powerhouse

The German economy has logged another quarter of expansion, the National Statistics Office has confirmed. It also said Europe's powerhouse logged a decent budget surplus for the first six months of the year. Germany's central bank (picture), the Bundesbank, expects full year-growth to come in at 1.7%.
