

Speaker Profile – Wolfgang Babeck

Hon. Adj. Prof. Dr. Dr. h.c. Wolfgang Babeck is an Australian/German solicitor and director.



He is admitted:

- as solicitor (Rechtsanwalt) in Germany; as solicitor of England & Wales; and as solicitor and notary of NSW.

Wolfgang has been a partner and lawyer with Buse Heberer Fromm since 1996 and additionally a European Council with Hall & Wilcox since 2018. Wolfgang has acted as resident and non-executive director for 30+ companies across a number of industries including biotechnology, information technology, manufacturing, automotive, renewable energy and education. Those included:

- Chairman of the supervisory board of a German Aktiengesellschaft, IT sector (6 years);
- Chairman of the advisory board of a German life sciences investment fund, GmbH (4 years);
- Chairman of the Australian subsidiary of a solar panel manufacturer (5 years);
- Director of the Australian subsidiary of an automotive supplier (5 years);
- Director of the Australian subsidiary of an mining supplier (3 years);
- Chairman of the Australian advisory board of a childcare provider (5 years current);
- Chairman of the International Law Section of the Law Council of Australia (2 years current) ;
- Co-Convenor of the Comparative Law Committee of the Law Council (4 years current);
- Chairman of the German-Australian Chamber of Industry and Commerce (1 year);
- Member of the advisory board of the Law Faculty of Bond University (current); and
- Graduate of the Australian Institute of Company Directors.

Wolfgang is an experienced moderator, facilitator, lecturer and presenter at panel discussions or conferences, training of trainers etc., always with a participatory approach. Some of his moderations include:

- Moderating several constitutional conference on request of the Parliament of Georgia;
- Moderating several panel discussion at the World Bank, Law Justice and Development Week;
