Sri Lanka Parliament Approves IMF Backed Central Bank Law

Sri Lanka's parliament passed a controversial new central bank law, with 66 legislators voting for and 23 against. The opposition criticized the law for lacking accountability, allowing the central bank to print money for growth and policy rate determination. The law is a under the **IMF** requirement program. Opposition legislators called for amendments to address weak accountability provisions. The central bank will continue to print money for government advances, raising concerns about the balance of payments. Critics warned that misusing certain clauses and powers could create instability, and there are no penalties for central bankers who fail to meet inflation targets set by parliament..

Sri Lanka to Open 24 Beach Properties for Tourism Investment

Sri Lanka will open 24 beach properties as top tourism hotspots for investment, according to Arundika Fernando, State Minister of Urban Development, Housing, and Coastal Conservation. These coastal areas have been identified as tourist attractions and will be given to new investors for temporary construction. Coastal protection precautions will be taken for these zones.

Germany Passes New Migration Law to Attract Skilled Workers

Germany's new migration law aims to attract skilled foreign workers by easing immigration requirements, addressing the country's skills shortage. Non-EU nationals with degrees obtained or recognized in Germany can work outside their field of study. Degree recognition is no longer mandatory if applicants have two years' professional experience and a recognized qualification from their home country.

The law introduces recognition partnerships, allowing individuals with job offers to work while their degrees are recognized. The act also relaxes EU Blue Card conditions and introduces a points-based "Opportunity Card" for job seekers, allowing them to stay for one year to find work and take up part-time employment.

Sri Lanka Considers Un-bundling SOEs as Part of Divestment Strategy

Sri Lanka may break up entities on track for privatization after a study by transaction advisors, said Suresh Shah, Director General of State Enterprises Reform Unit. SriLankan Airlines, with catering, engineering, and ground handling operations, is one entity where separate selling proposals were considered. The decision on divestment, bundled or unbundled, applies not only to SriLankan Airlines but also to other listed companies. Financial advisors will present options and pros and cons for each entity, with the final structure requiring cabinet approval. The first expression of interest for select entities will be called in August, with the sales likely to be completed by early 2024.

BOI processes \$ 604Mn Investment Projects up to May

ISri Lankan government's ultimatum to investors with valuable state lands: Restart delayed projects or risk takeover. State Minister of Urban Development and Housing, Arundika Fernando, stated that if investors fail to decide by the end of August, the government will offer the projects to new investors. Land availability remains a key constraint for investors in Sri Lanka. After the country's sovereign debt default in April last year, investment projects had stalled. With economic recovery and IMF reforms, the government is fast-tracking investments secured on long-term leases.

Sri Lanka Eases Exchange Controls on Companies and Migrating Citizens

Sri Lanka has relaxed exchange controls for individuals and companies migrating abroad, initially imposed during a currency crisis triggered by liquidity injections. The country's ad hoc pegging regime, known as a flexible exchange rate, weakened. Exchange controls have been in place for decades due to conflicting monetary anchors, hindering trade and prosperity. Under the new rules effective for six months from June 28, companies can remit funds for overseas business setup or expansion, and limits on capital transaction remittances and working capital for overseas branches have been increased. The limits on individual migration and subsequent remittances have also been raised.

Estimate by the IMF

The IMF has released an updated economic forecast, revealing that the global economy is experiencing slow growth and facing several risks, despite some improvement. The IMF has raised its growth forecast for the global economy slightly from 2.8 to 3.0 percent, though this is lower than the annual average of 3.8 percent between 2000 and 2019, prior to the pandemic.

Projection by ADB

Inflation in developing Asia is forecast at 3.6% this year, compared with an April forecast of 4.2%. The inflation outlook for 2024, meanwhile, is raised to 3.4% from an earlier estimate of 3.3%.

Inflation

After two years, in June 2023, Food inflation (Y-o-Y) decreased to 4.1% from 21.5% in May 2023, and Non-Food inflation (Y-o-Y) dropped to 16.2% from 27.0% in May 2023. The CCPI's monthly change in June 2023 was recorded at 0.02%, primarily due to offsetting price increases in the Food category (0.41%) and price decreases in the Non-Food category (-0.39%). Core inflation (Y-o-Y), which reflects underlying inflation, also declined to 9.8% in June 2023 from 20.3% in May 2023.

Trade Statistics

Sri Lanka's merchandise exports increased by 16.6 % to US\$ 989.7 Million in May 2023 compared to April 2023. However, it is a 5.59 % decrease when compared to May 2022.

Sri Lanka's Economy Shrank by 11.5% in Q1

Sri Lanka's Q1 2023 GDP contracted at an estimated 11.5%. The country's Gross Domestic Product at constant prices (2015) declined from Rs. 3,519,400 million in Q1 2022 to Rs. 3,114,187 million. The Agriculture sector grew by 0.8%, while Industries and Services sectors experienced negative growth rates of 23.4% and 5.0%, respectively.

<u>Apparel and Textile Exports</u>

Export earnings from Apparel & Textile have decreased by 14.55 % y-o-y to US\$ 412.43 Million in May 2023 compared to May 2022.

Rubber-based Exports

Export earnings from Rubber and Rubber Finished products have increased by 0.20 % y-o-y to US\$ 76.84 Million in May 2023, with positive performance in exports of Pneumatic & Retreated Rubber Tyres & Tubes (6.82 %).


Tea Exports

Export earnings from tea which made up 12% of merchandise exports, increased by 24.16 % y-o-y to US\$ 116.33 Mn in May 2023 compared to May 2022. Earnings from export of Tea packets increased by 25.76 % to US\$ 56.58 Mn.

Coconut-based Exports

Sri Lanka being the largest contributor to Coconut based sector, Coco Peat, Fiber Pith & Moulded products which are categorized under the Coconut fibre products, decreased by 9.81 % to US\$ 15.45 Mn in May 2023 in comparison to May 2022.

Foreign Exchange

During the year up to 28th July 2023, the Sri Lanka rupee appreciated against the US dollar by 10.3 per cent. Given the cross currency exchange rate movements, the Sri Lanka rupee appreciated against the Japanese yen by 15.9 per cent, the pound sterling by 3.8 per cent, the Euro by 7.0 per cent and the Indian rupee by 9.4 per cent during this period.



Import Performance of Sri Lanka




Tourism Sector

In June 2023, Sri Lanka experienced a significant increase in international tourist arrivals compared to the same period in 2022. The number of foreign tourist arrivals rose by 205.5 % year-onyear, reaching 100,388 visitors. However, compared to May 2023, there has been a incrase of 20% in tourist arrivals, indicating the start of the mid peak season in Sri Lanka.

According to UNWTO international tourism is set to sustain its recovery throughout the year, benefiting from strong pent-up demand, continuous enhancement of air connectivity, and China's recent reopening. The top countries of origin for tourists in June were India, United Kingdom, Russian Federation, Australia and China.

DHL has signed a contract to purchase 11.5 million liters of SAF Scope 3* transport emissions reductions in 2023. The SAF, certified by International Sustainability & Carbon Certification (ISCC) and produced from used cooking oil and food waste, has at least 80% lower lifecycle emissions than conventional jet fuel. The partnership marks another milestone in the journey towards more sustainable air freight and is aligned with Deutsche Post DHL Group's sustainability goals to achieve net-zero emissions logistics by 2050. DHL uses only sustainably produced SAF made from waste sources, such as food waste or used cooking oil.

"We are sure that creating a more sustainable freight sector can only be achieved collaboratively. Therefore, we are constantly looking for other companies to cooperate with and are very happy to announce our newest partnership with IAG Cargo.
