The new government announced a set of tax concessions which include the annulment of the Nation Building Tax (NBT), Capital Gain Tax, Withholding Tax and the reduction of VAT from15% to 8%. A reduction of the Income and PAYE Tax was announced for the first trimester of 2020. The tax reform is meant to conduct to more foreign direct investments and to increase national consumption and export.

Sri Lanka's largest Foreign Direct Investment project, "Colombo Port City" has been officially opened on 7th of December for investors. We are confident that the new landmark of Sri Lanka will be a major hub for the country's economy and attract more FDIs into the country.

To discuss business opportunities and common positions under the new presidency, the Delegation of German Industry and Commerce in Sri Lanka organized a "CEOs Dinner" with the participation of the German Ambassador and CEOs and representatives of German companies in Sri Lanka. German companies are committed to fair business, level playing field and open markets. We will continue our activities already in January 2020. From 27th to 30th of January a German business delegation on sustainable mobility will visit Colombo. The meeting allowed all participants to present their interests and comments on the identified topics including the regulatory framework for the sector, vocational training in the logistic sector and opportunities for port infrastructure developments in Sri Lanka. Further, it was highlighted the importance of participation in sector specific trade fairs like "transport logistic China 2020" which is Asia's biggest and most exciting fair for transport & logistic sector. AHK Sri Lanka always develops strategic approaches to promote Sri Lanka at a global level which is proven by the first Sri Lankan pavilion at the world's leading logistics fair "transport logistic 2019" which was organized by the AHK Sri Lanka.

Eventually, the committee agreed to proceed a whitepaper and submit to the present government for their close attention and immediate action towards the identified areas.



Sector Committee for Tourism

The tourism sector committee of AHK Sri Lanka held its 3rd meeting on 28th of November 2019 at the kind invitation of Mr. Andreas Hergenröther, chief delegate of German Industry and Commerce in Sri Lanka. Nine active members took part in the meeting, including a representative from the Ministry of Tourism for the first time.

The committee generally covers the topics of development and sustainability of Sri Lanka's tourism infrastructure, management and training.

During the 3rd gathering, the tourism committee underlined the significance of relaunching a direct flight connection between Colombo and Frankfurt. In order to form a distinctive tourism strategy, all committee participants proposed and discussed the preparation of a position paper regarding the necessary improvements of the tourism sector in Sri Lanka including infrastructure, tariffs and trained staffs. Based on the discussion, the committee identified four key measures which are necessary restore the Sri Lankan tourism.

- Intensifying communication efforts with tourism offices in Germany
- The continuation and expansion of a nationwide series of roadshows through organizations that have corresponding capacities
- The launch of an innovative and contentdriven digital marketing campaign
- Increasing Sri Lankan's visibility as a tourist destination at the global level through the frequent participation in international events.

The AHK sector committee for tourism comprises of representatives from leading hotels, travel agencies and airlines as well as government agencies.

The business trip itself will take place from 23 – 25 March 2020. Program

Costs

This business trip will take place within the framework of the German Energy Solutions Initiative which is coordinated and financed by the German Federal Ministry for Economic Affairs and Energy (BMWi). Yet, all participants have to bear the expenses for their respective flights, visa, board and lodging. In this context, please note that flight costs to Düsseldorf Airport may vary but an amount of about 600-800 Euros (140,000 – 160,000 LKR) can be expected. We kindly ask you to wait with the booking of your flight tickets until the trip has been officially approved by the Ministry for Economic Affairs and Energy in Germany, about which we will keep you informed. A hotel in Düsseldorf will be recommended by AHK Sri Lanka at the given time. AHK Sri Lanka will collect 70,000 LKR (plus VAT) to cover the booking costs for the hotel and the lunches.

In return, AHK Sri Lanka will assist you with the application for your visa and offers an interesting program which grants you and your company the opportunity to learn about new technologies and ways to implement these in the Sri Lankan system.

Trade fairs in Germany – key instruments for developing new

What do companies require to successfully develop international markets? They need to make contacts with potential customers, they need distribution and service partners, and they need platforms where they can present their products and their business to the public. Achieving these goals requires either a broad palette of instruments, or a single, well-prepared presentation at a trade fair. Trade fairs are by far the most versatile of broad-spectrum marketing instruments. The importance of trade fairs for smaller businesses is reflected in the exhibitor mix, with over half of all businesses employing a staff of less than 50 employees.

German trade fairs make it easy for businesses to reach their target groups. From additive manufacturing to construction machinery and from food to electronic games – there is a specialist trade fair for nearly every industry. Around 170 trade fairs of international or national significance are held in Germany every year.

However, their appeal is not restricted to those wishing to do business with German companies. Trade fairs have become important meeting places for exhibitors and visitors from all over the world. Over half of all exhibitors are from abroad, and one third of these come from countries outside Europe. And around one third of the trade visitors are from abroad.

Foreign companies exhibiting their products and services at trade fairs in Germany can use this opportunity to gain new customers both in Europe and further afield. Importers visiting trade fairs in Germany can explore a spectrum of products from around the globe and compare their quality and pricing.

But the international character of German trade fairs is not the only factor that appeals to exhibitors and visitors from around the world. There are at least six other key factors:

German trade fairs are organised by professionals: the organisers have extensive experience in the development and management of interna-tional trade fairs and draw on the services of highly specialised and in-ternationally experienced experts for their marketing, sales, service and engineering requirements.

German trade fair organisers market their services to exhibitors and visitors around the world: The larger trade fair companies maintain a global network of agencies in order to inform exhibitors and visitors locally. More than 500 information centres located around the globe provide easy access to German trade fair organisers.



Exhibitors, visitors and organisers engage in long-term cooperation: One key factor in the success of the German trade fair industry is the close cooperation of the various parties in advisory committees and other bodies. These arrangements ensure that trade fairs are developed and scheduled in line with market requirements.

The services available to exhibitors at trade fairs in Germany are internationally leading: German trade fair companies constantly seek to extend their range of services. They support exhibitors looking for stand con-struction companies, multilingual personnel, travel booking services or press and marketing services.

Germany offers exhibition centres and infrastructures that are among the best in the world. The high quality of Germany's transport infra-structure is a crucial factor in minimizing transport time and costs to and from trade fairs.

Trade fairs in Germany offer excellent value for money: exhibitors enjoy access to a high volume of quality visitors while paying comparatively modest stand rentals. The low percontact cost ratio enjoyed by exhibitors at German trade fairs compares favourably with both international competitors and other channels.

Therefore, more and more exhibitors and visitors from countries around the world bank on trade fairs made in Germany when planning to develop new markets.



New Government announces tax concession galore



The new government announced a heap of tax concessions which included the annulment of Nation Building Tax (NBT), Capital Gain Tax, Withholding Tax and the reduction of VAT to 8 per cent from 15.

The proposal made by President Gotabaya Rajapaksa in this regard was approved by the Cabinet of the new government which held its maiden meeting today.

Announcing the decision, Co-Cabinet Spokesperson and Minister, Dr. Bandula Gunawardana said most of the tax restructuring will come into effect from December 1.

"The proposal made by the President to revive the economy was approved today. Prime Minister and Finance Minister Mahinda Rajapaksa will see to it that laws and regulations are amended to make way for these concessions and issue necessary gazettes by December 1," Minister Gunawardana said at the maiden Cabinet news briefing.

Accordingly, he said the Nation Building Tax, Economic Service Charge, Debit Tax on banking on financial institutions, Capital Gain Tax stock market transactions, VAT on the condominium property, Pay As You Earn Income Tax, Withholding Tax and Debt Servicing Taxes will be removed.

Minister Gunawardana said the NBT which was 2 per cent on goods and services would be removed and the 15 per cent VAT on goods and services will be cut down to 8 per cent.

"Tax-free threshold for turnover for VAT will be raised from Rs.1 million per month to Rs.25 million per month or Rs.300 million per annum to provide immediate relief especially to the small and medium sector enterprises in all sectors. The tourism industry will be treated as export for zero rates provided that 60 per cent of turnover is sourced from local suppliers. All religious places of worship will be exempted from all forms of taxes, all foreign exchange revenue will be made free from income taxes and the telecommunication tax will be reduced by 25 per cent," he said.

The proposed tax reforms will also make the information technology service free from taxes.

Any form of monthly earning of Rs.250,000, Rs.500,000 and Rs.750,000 and above will be imposed an income tax of 6 per cent, 12 per cent and 18 per cent respectively.

PAYE taxes would be removed for earning on the all-inclusive monthly income of Rs.250,000 in place of the current ceiling of Rs.125,000 per month for all public and private sector employees with effect from January 1, 2020.

In the proposal, President Rajapaksa recommended that imports of tea, pepper, raw rubber, cinnamon and other locally made small industrial products be either placed on negative list or subject to high custom-based taxes.\

The proposal also said that items which are not manufactured in any form and also beneficial for the country to have access to global sources will be made duty free. "Machinery and equipment which are not made in Sri Lanka along with advanced technology will be made duty free. Preferential rate under various trade agreements will be reviewed having regard to national interest and obligations in terms of such trade agreements," the proposal said.

Commenting on how the government would increase its income which will go down as a result of tax concessions, Minister Gunawardana said they expect to widen the net of taxpayers so as to increase the income from direct taxes.

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Colombo Port City opens for investors

Colombo's landmark project, the Colombo Port City, is open to investors from 9th of December 2019, after it was declared open by Prime Minister Mahinda Rajapaksa on Saturday at a colourful ceremony.

Accompanied by the Chinese Ambassador to Sri Lanka Cheng Xueyuan, the Prime Minister officially declare the 269 hectares of land reclaimed from the sea for the project as part of the Colombo District. The Government will follow up this up in the coming months with several programs to be launched attract investors.

Prime Minister Mahinda Rajapaksa delivering short remarks at the ceremony said the Government would support and accelerate the development of the Colombo Port City project. It was also reported the Prime Minister had pledged to accelerate the implementation of regulations tailor-made for the Port City as early as January 2020 and promote it as an attractive investment option for investors at the earliest.

Port City Colombo, an extension of Sri Lanka's vibrant commercial capital, will comprise five different districts, which will include a Financial District, Central Park Living, Island Living, The Marina and the International Island. When completed, Port City Colombo will have over 5.6 million square meters of built space, with the best in design and standards. It aims to attract investments in healthcare, education, entertainment, hotels and restaurants, retail and office spaces with an integrated resort and a marina, offering a best in living experience by the Indian Ocean.

Construction of the \$ 1.5 billion Colombo Port City project was launched on 17 September 2014 in the presence of former President Mahinda Rajapaksa and Chinese President Xi Jinping. The agreement for the Port City was renegotiated and signed in August 2016. The former administration of Prime Minister Ranil Wickremesinghe had planned to establish an International Financial Centre on the share of land allocated to the Sri Lankan Government. It is however, now unclear as to whether this will continue. A \$1 billion project to construct the building to house the International Financial Centre was also approved by Cabinet in late 2017. Sri Lankan electronics and electrical sector excels at Productronica 2019 in Germany

Participation in an international exhibition and fair of this magnitude can undoubtedly give us lots of exposure in terms of new leads, competitors and collaboration possibilities, said Entgra Ltd. Founder and Chief Executive Officer Sumedha Rubasinghe.

Sri Lankan electronics and electrical sector companies benefitted from Sri Lanka's participation in the first-ever Productronica 2019 event in Germany organised by the Sri Lanka Export Development Board (EDB) from 12-15 November at Messe München, Germany, with the assistance of the Sri Lankan Embassy in Germany and the Consulate General of Sri Lanka in Frankfurt.

The total business generated was around \$ 3.3 million to \$ 5.3 million and roughly 65 business linkages are under negotiation and are set to be confirmed by the end of 2020.

The Sri Lankan exhibitors at Productronica 2019 also showcased their products and services at Semicon Europa, the largest European electronics platform connecting industry leaders across the entire manufacturing supply chain from every segment and sector of the European microelectronics industries including Semiconductors, LEDs, MEMS and printed, organic, flexible and other adjacent markets.

Moreover, the EDB is hoping to organise a Sri Lanka pavillion at Electronica 2020 at the same venue for the betterment of the Sri Lankan electronics and electrical sector (http://www.srilankabusiness.com/electric al-and-electronics/). Vario Systems AG stated that the company met new and potential customers, understood what competitors were doing and gained new technological insight while using the event as a platform to invite existing customers. The company said it was important to participate in these kinds of global trade fairs to meet buyers, suppliers and customers in different market segments.

Cable Solutions Ltd. was able to acquire around \$ 0.2-\$ 0.3 million worth of contracts from its maiden participation. It said it understood the importance of presenting at a global exhibition with exposure to the European market. Visitors with whom it had worked had the opportunity to see its product range for the first time. It revealed that the visitor profile and size of the exhibition allowed it to explore new business aspects and opportunities which otherwise would not have been seen with self-marketing.

Kelani Cables Plc said the major benefit of its participation was the broader knowledge gained through the vast European market for wire harnesses. Europe is a quality focus market and it presents a golden opportunity for Sri Lankan companies in the electronic and electrical sector that participated at this trade fair.

Entgra Ltd. was able to connect with highly relevant leads that could possibly be converted into customers. Furthermore, it said participation at an international exhibition or fair of this magnitude could undoubtedly afford exposure in terms of possibilities for new leads, competitors and collaboration.


