Dear readers,

Top German Brands in Sri Lanka 2021 has been virtually launched in the presence of the German Ambassador on 2nd of February. We are very proud that finally 176 German brands -despite the current pandemic- have joined the Top German Brands initiative, which is an increase of 13% compared to last year. This clearly underlines the strong commitment of German companies to the Sri Lankan market and the long-term approach that German companies generally have. 2020 was a very challenging year for our two economies. Economic growth is forecasted to decrease by 5% in Germany, German exports to Sri Lanka decreased by 26,3% in the year 2020, while Sri Lankan exports to Germany decreased by 5,1%. German exports to Sri Lanka amounted to about 236 Mio. Euro, while Sri Lankan exports were more than three times higher reaching about 718 Mio. Euro.

German global exports declined by 9,2% to 1,205 trillion Euro during the year 2020 while German global imports dropped by 7,1% to 1,026 trillion Euro. With a positive trade balance of 179 bn Euro Germany is the country with the world's largest trade balance.

Germany has been for decades a strategic partner for the economic development in Sri Lanka. 2019 the market German was the third largest export destination for Sri Lankan businesses. German tourists with almost 2.2 Mio. nights spent were ranked third in the country ranking of tourists' nights spent in Sri Lanka. When it comes to FDIs the German portfolio is one of the most diversified in Sri Lanka. From producers of apparel/textile, automotive parts, industrial gases, construction chemicals, solid tires, and organic agriculture to sophisticated service providers in the field of tourism, IT, healthcare, banking, insurance, and logistics, German investments are represented in all key sectors of the Sri Lankan economy.

COVID-19 Update

As of 10 February 2021, Sri Lanka accounted for 71,211 COVID-19 confirmed cases, while recovered individuals totaled 65,053 and fatalities related to COVID-19 amount to 370 individuals.

Import Restrictions

The Import and Export Control Department issued Gazette 2209/18 on 05 January 2021, and included new pneumatic tyres (under HS heading 40.11) in Schedule I.

Further, the Import and Export Control Department issued operating instructions 05/2021 on 03 February 2021 and continued to suspend the import restrictions on tiles and ceramic sanitaryware products, until further notice.

Taxes on Ceramic Tiles and Sanitaryware Imports

Import duties of ceramic tiles and sanitaryware were increased to 30% from 15%. A flat rate of CESS amounting to LKR 125 per kilo was approved.

Operating instructions for the clearance of imported goods

The Import and Export Control Department issued operating instructions 02/2021 to all commercial banks on advance payments in foreign currency, and the clearing of imported goods to the country. The said instructions are valid till 13 February 2021.

Commercial Banks will pay advance payments of amounts exceeding USD 50,000 if the importation is made within the time stipulated in regulation 8(1) and 8(2) of the Extraordinary Gazette no. 1739/3 dated 02.01.2012.

Private companies are required to submit business/company registration documents; VAT and TIN certificates, agreement between importer and exporter, form 1 and/or form 20 of Department of Company Registration, Article of Association, and confirmation by the importer of the importation date.

Government agencies are required to submit the VAT and TIN certificates if available, agreement between exporter and importer, confirmation by the importer on the importation date, and the recommendation of the secretary to the line ministry.

Commercial banks will release the documents for clearance purpose from Sri Lanka Customs if importation is not made within the period stipulated in the regulation 8(1), 8(2) and 8(3) of extraordinary gazette no 1739/3 dated 02.01.2012.

Commercial banks will make a maximum payment of USD 50,000 as the payment of an importer per two weeks on unpaid import bills relating to the goods imported under Document of Acceptance after the period stipulated in regulation 9(1) of extraordinary gazette no 1739/3 dated 02.01.2012.

Commercial banks will make a maximum payment of USD 50,000 as the payment of an importer per two weeks on unpaid bills relating to goods imported under Open Account after the period stipulated in regulation 11(1 a) of extraordinary gazette no 1739/3 dated 02.01.2012.

Tripartite agreement to pro-rate wages extended till March 2021

The tripartite agreement to pro-rate wages based on the varied of levels of deployment of staff owing to the COVID-19 Pandemic was extended till March 2021. Based on the basic salary, employers will apportion and pay wages for the number of days the employee has worked for. For the number of days that the employee was considered as 'benched' without any work, wages will be apportioned and paid either at the rate of 50% of the basic wage or LKR 14,500, whichever is higher.

New regulation for incoming passengers

Foreigners with tourist visa, Sri Lankans who hold dual citizenship, Sri Lankan family members with a Sri Lanka passport accompanying a foreign national, and foreign passport holder with a valid residence visa will not be subject to a mandatory minimum stay.

Prior to departure it is mandatory for the passenger to have a hotel booking for up to 14 days of stay in a certified Level-1 hotel. It is mandatory to make the PCR-test payment (USD 40 per test) and COVID-19 insurance payment (USD 12 per passenger) to the hotel or travel agent when making the hotel booking.

The said guidelines do not apply to Business Visa Holders and Diplomats.

Deregulation commission appointed to simplify existing laws

President Gotabaya Rajapaksa appointed an 18-member Deregulation Commission with public sector veterans, private sector leaders, legal experts, and industry professionals to simplify the existing and regulations.

The commission was given 90-days to fulfill the following six key tasks:

- 1) Review all laws, regulations and circular instructions pertaining to Government finance, revenue laws and circular instructions, licensing and permit arrangements, investments, approvals and building permits, and circumstances influencing such regulations.
- Assess as to whether the issuance of regulations and circular instructions has resulted in over regulation and deviated from the scope and objectives of original legislations.
- Assess the relevance of them in the context of global standards and applicability of them in the Sri Lankan context to identify new rooms to adopt to make the most effective modern regulatory systems.
- 4) Assess the cost of enforcement to the state, compliance cost to the people and potentials for corruption and irregular practices associated with complex and over regulatory systems.
- 5) Identify areas where simplifications

and rationalization could be made to existing regulations and circular instructions and issue directions to do away, modify if required and simplify all such regulations.

6) Study if there is a repetition that occurs due to issuing various approvals, permits and licenses through the national level, Provincial Councils, and local authorities, and take necessary measures to amend such processes appropriately.

To support the deregulation initiative, the Delegation of German Industry and Commerce (AHK Sri Lanka) will collaborate with the Friedrich Naumann Foundation to conduct a survey and submit a report to the deregulation committee.

AHK Sri Lanka will conduct the survey among key stakeholders, industry experts and representative companies. The final report will summarize the key findings from the primary analysis of the survey data.

The aim of the report is to present industry-driven findings and probable solutions to deregulation in Sri Lanka. The study will encompass topics concerning market access — free and fair competition, entrepreneurship and firm ownership, public procurement of goods and services, land acquisition, trade and customs, and sector specific topics that include electricity, water, transport, finance, healthcare, and medical products.



GDP Growth

Statistics by DCS

According to the Q3 2020 GDP statistics published by the Department of Census and Statistics in Sri Lanka, growth in July-September 2020 was +1.5%, compared to a growth of +2.4% in Q3 2019.

Projections by CBSL

As per the medium-term macroeconomic framework of the Central Bank of Sri Lanka, economic growth in 2020 is projected to contract by -1.7%, compared to a 2.3% growth in the previous year.

The economy is expected to grow by 5.0% in 2021.

Forecast by the World Bank

According to the Global Economic Prospects report published by the World Bank on 01 January 2020, the GDP growth of Sri Lanka is expected to contract by -6.7% in 2020 and grow by +3.3% in 2021 and +2.0% in 2022.

Inflation

Headline inflation as measured by the National Consumer Price Index decreased to 4.6% in December 2020 from 5.2% in November 2020.

Foreign Currency Reserves and Exchange Rates

From the beginning of the year until 09 February 2021, the Sri Lankan rupee depreciated against the US dollar by 4.6% to an indicative rate of LKR 194.36. The Sri Lankan rupee depreciated against the Euro by 3.5% and the pound sterling by 5.3% to an indicative rate of LKR 234.70 and LKR 267.74, respectively.

As of 31 December 2020, Official Reserve Assets amounted to USD 5,665.1 Mn while the Foreign Currency Reserves totaled USD 5,186.0 Mn.

On 25 January 2021, the Central Bank of Sri Lanka suspended hedging instruments offered in the market, including forward contracts and swaps until 25 April 2021.


Foreign Trade

Export Sector

According to the statistics published by the Export Development Board, Sri Lanka's merchandise exports remain at USD 9.9 Bn in 2020, compared to USD 11.9 Bn in 2019.

Export Earnings in December 2020 amounted to USD 931.65 Mn, which is a decline 6.91% compared to December 2019. Sri Lanka's export earnings in December 2020 increased by 13.75% relative to November 2020.

The export volume index declined by 7.9% and the unit value index declined by 9.1% in November 2020.



German Exports to Sri Lanka

German exports to Sri Lanka in 2020 declined by -26.3% to EURO 233,510,000 compared to EURO 316,812,000 last year.

German Imports from Sri Lanka

Germany imported from Sri Lanka goods amounting to EURO 717,690,000 in 2020, compared to EURO 756,135,000 in the same period of the previous year, indicating a decline of -5.1%.

Sri Lankan Global Exports

Tea Industry

Export earnings from tea which made up 12% of merchandise exports increased by 6.78% y-o-y to USD 112.97 Mn in December 2020 compared to December 2019. Between January-December 2020 export earnings from tea amounted to USD 1,240.94 Mn, a decline of -7.83% compared to the previous year.

Rubber and rubber-finished products Industry

Export earnings from Rubber & Rubber finished products have increased by 6.22 % y-o-y to US\$ 79.52 Mn in December 2020. Between January-December 2020 export earnings from the rubber industry amounted to USD 816.17 Mn, a decline of -8.33% compared to the previous year.

Coconut and coconut-based products Industry

Export earnings in December 2020 amounted to USD 54.88 Mn. Between January-December 2020 export earnings from the coconut industry amounted to USD 664.54 Mn, a growth of 8.27% compared to the previous year.

Apparel Industry

Export earnings from Apparel & Textiles declined by 6.46 % to USD 450.49 Mn during the month of December 2020 compared with USD 481.59 Mn indicated in December 2019. Between January-December 2020 export earnings from apparels amounted to USD 4,405.84 Mn, a decline of -21.01% compared to the previous year.


Spice Industry

Export earnings from spices during the period January-December 2020 amounted to USD 335.47 Mn, indicating a growth of 7.12% compared to the previous year.

Sri Lankan Global Imports

Merchandise imports for the period January-October 2019 declined by -19.9%, to USD 13,145 Mn on a year-on-year basis. Expenditure on merchandise imports in October 2020 amounted to USD 1,363 Mn.

In November 2020, the import volume index and unit value index declined by -12.0% and -9.7% respectively.




Vehicle Imports

Vehicle imports in November 2020 amounted to USD 0.5 Mn (-99.4% y-o-y). Between January and November 2020, vehicle imports amounted to USD 282.4 Mn, indicating a decline of -61.4 compared to the previous year.


Manufacturing Sector Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI)

The manufacturing sector PMI in December 2020 increased to 61.2 index points, which is an increase of 3.6 index points compared to November 2020.



Services Sector Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI)

The Services sector PMI amounted to 55.6 in December 2020, which is an increase of 6.8 index point compared to November 2020.

Tourism Sector

Sri Lanka reopened its' international borders from 21 January 2021 and resumed commercial flight operations to/from Sri Lanka.

Between January-December 2020, tourist arrivals amounted to 507,704, which is a decline of -73.5% compared to 1,913,702 in the previous year.


Virtual Launch of Top German Brands in Sri Lanka 2021

Referring to the fact that Sri Lankan exports to Germany were three times higher than German exports to Sri Lanka he added:" Germany is committed to free and fair trade. Bilateral trade degenerating into a oneway street is neither free nor fair."



In fact, German exports to Sri Lanka decreased until the end of November by 25.8%, while Sri Lankan exports to Germany decreased by 5.8%. Until the end of November German exports to Sri Lanka were about 215 Mio. Euro in the year 2020, while Sri Lankan exports were more than three times higher reaching about 664 Mio. Euro.

After presentations of BOI Chairman Sanjaya Mohottala on investment conditions in Sri Lanka and Head of Risk Management Solutions of Deutsche Bank Dhakshitha Serasundera on foreign exchange development the participants had the opportunity to continue the discussion with the speakers.

"It has become increasingly difficult for clients to manage their FX exposure, given the unprecedented current market environment and volatility which could continue in the near term. Deutsche Bank has been operating in Sri Lanka for 40 years and has been supporting its clients to meet their daily transaction banking and foreign exchange requirements through many different economic cycles" stated Dhakshitha Serasundera.

In order to support current and future German investments in Sri Lanka, the German - Sri Lankan Fast Track Dialogue, which was initiated in 2019 by former Minister Hon. Malik Samarawickrama, the German Embassy and AHK Sri Lanka, will be continued on 25th of February. German companies will have the opportunity to discuss in a resultoriented way with the BOI Chairman and other Sri Lankan authorities' concrete challenges opportunities with regards to their existing or future investments.










Discussion with Sri Lankan exhibitors for Fruit Logistica 2021



The multiple sensors and microprocessors chipped inside intelligently identify the wash time,

water pressure and adjust the wash cycle accordingly.

8. Reload forgotten laundry:

Forgot to add those socks? You can load the forgotten laundry to the machine in the middle of the pre-soak cycle before the detergent is dispensed.


