Ghabbour Brothers Schools Mid-term Examinations

In January the examinations started for Ghabbour Schools – Imbaba, Alexandria and Kafr ElZayat. AHK has examined 261 apprentices in five days in three different subjects (Mechatronics, Paint and Body). The theoretical examinations were on 19th of January 2020 for the three schools and the following 4 days were the practical examinations for the apprentices in the three schools. To examine the apprentices, AHK has relied on 40 independent external examiners to work on the stations for practical examinations and in the examination rooms for the theoretical exams to ensure professionalism and transparency in the process.

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
GEVET Board Meeting on the 2nd of February @ AHK premises
