About the Program



The Transatlantic Cluster Initiative brings together leading German and US industry clusters to promote knowledge exchange through content-driven encounters. The program is organized by the German American Chamber of Commerce of the Midwest (GACC Midwest) and is supported by the German Federal Ministry for Economic Affairs and Energy through the European Recovery Program.

The core program of the Cluster Initiative will connect German and American cluster organizations through targeted roadshow series in the US and delegation trips to Germany. The program establishes an exchange for best-practices focused on cluster management, internationalization, cluster policy, recruitment of a skilled workforce, technology development and transfer, and much more. As an increasing array of clusters join the Cluster Initiative, other opportunities for an ongoing dialog will be pursued.

Program Details

The ERP Program is funding a series of 4 programs, each focused on a different industry. Previous programs revolved around the topics of: Metalworking; Lightweighting Technologies and Materials; Health Care and Medical Technology, Industry 4.0, E-Mobility and Sustainability in Food Processing . Possible future themes to be addressed include: again Lightweighting Technologies and Materials, Transportation and Logistics; Health IT; Life Science; Start-ups, IT and Digitalization; Waste- & Water Management; and many more.

Each program will entail an industry specific roadshow in the US and a delegation trip to Germany. The roadshows in the US will include targeted industry events at 2-3 US locations, while the delegation trips will offer 10-12 select participants to explore Germany during an intensive 5-day trip.

- Host cluster representatives from Germany for at least one day of programming organized with GACC Midwest at partner location (host organization provides venue/marketing support for 80 people, AV, and catering)
- Additional financial support for the roadshow in the US (e.g. for transportation to site visits)

Delegation Trip to Germany

- 5-day trip to Germany to explore the targeted industry
- Program fee: \$450*
- Participants are responsible for their own air fare to and from Germany.

*Program fee covers six (6) overnight stays, meals, cultural activities, entrance fees, and transportation as part of the program agenda while in Germany.
